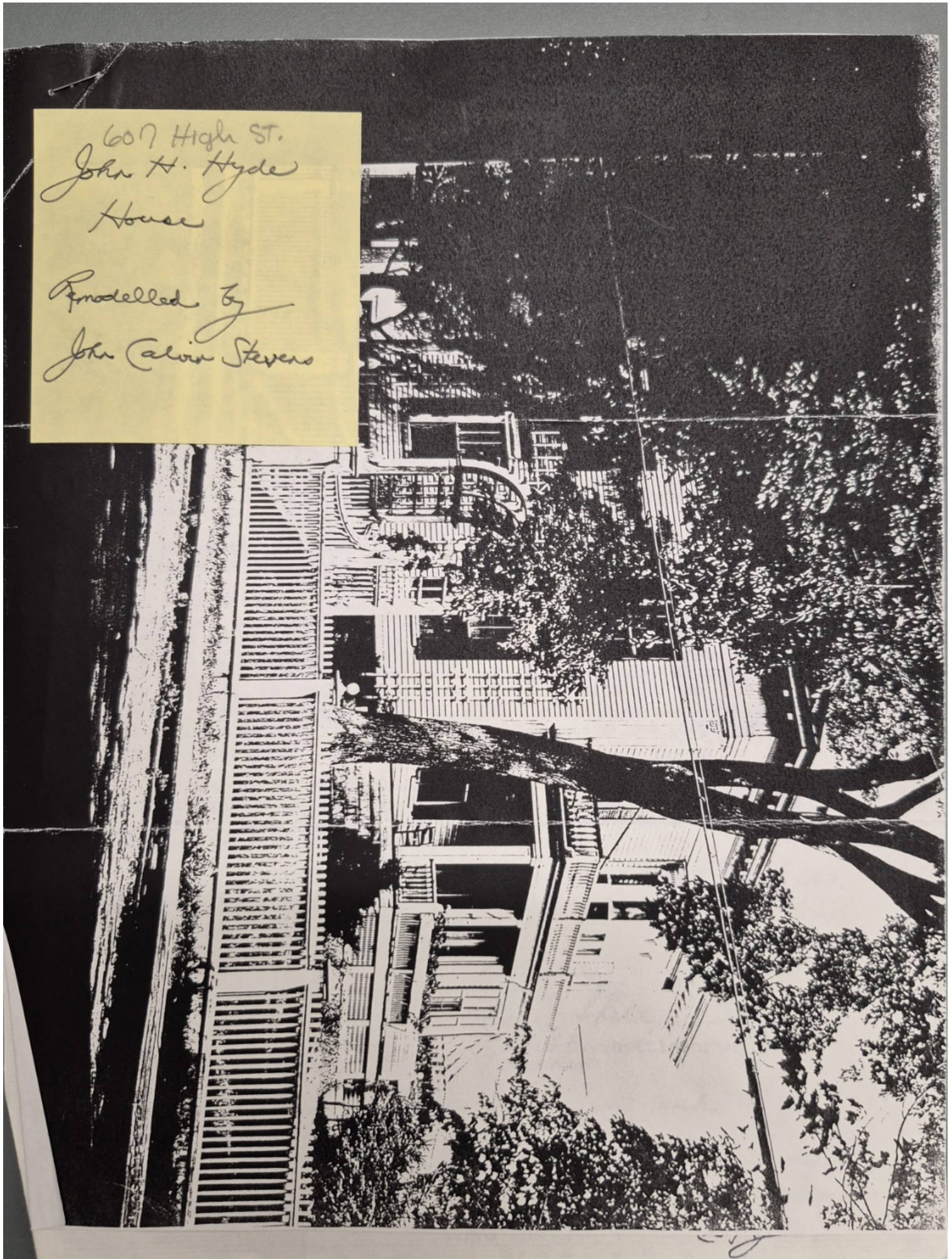

Dear Gordon:

Thank you for your letter of April 14, 1990, inquiring about the house at 955 Washington Street.

I have checked the records of the Stevens firm at the Maine Historical Society in Portland and find a notation for Stevens altering an old house in Bath for John S. Hyde in 1904. No street location is given, and the original plans were destroyed. I recall that the Maine Maritime Museum may have Stevens blueprints for remodellings of this house and the one adjacent to it on the corner. Perhaps they came with Hyde Family papers. Nathan would know for certain if these are in the collection and to which houses they pertain.

Stevens also remodelled a house for John H. Hyde, which stands on High Street across from "Elmherst". I have enclosed a copy of a photo from one of the firm's albums which documents this. Again, no drawings apparently survive.

Based on these sketchy leads, please let me know what you find about 955 Washington Street.
