HEROIN THOUGHT CAUSE OF YOUTH'S DEATH

Life moved to (sic) fast for "Tommy" Thompson. This morning, acquaintances recalled "Tommy" as "a friendly face with always a cheery 'hello'" as he passed in the halls at Palm Springs High School. Last night 18-year-old Thomas Charles Thompson died alone in a modest home he shared with his mother at 2300 Cerritos Road. Authorities believe he was killed by an overdose of heroin. This afternoon, in the grim confines of the Riverside County coroner's office at Indio, an autopsy will be performed to prove or disprove what Palm Springs police and a physician on duty in the emergency room at Desert Hospital believe to be the cause of the youth's untimely death. Young "Tommy" Thompson had a friend who tried desperately to save his life. That friend, John Chevalier of 974 San Lucas Road, believes that "Tommy" probably was beyond help when he found him unconscious in the Cerritos Road home of his mother, Lacille. Chevalier tried unsuccessfully to revive him, then called for help. On the records at Desert Hospital, the official deal of Thomas Charles Thompson is listed at 10:15 p.m. on a rather chilly Monday night, just 18 years and nine months after his birth in picturesque Coronado, Calif.

CAUSE PROBED: YOUTH FOUND DEAD

19-year-old College of the Desert student and son of a prominent Palm Springs architect, found dead yesterday in an apartment in Indio, possibly was the victim of an overdose of drugs, police in that city said today. The body of young Richard Arnett Harrison was found early yesterday morning by a roommate in their apartment at 82-640 Miles Ave. The dead youth's parents are Mr. and Mrs. Richard A. Harrison of 1055 Suntan Lane in Palm Springs. Harrison is head of the architectural firm bearing his name, located at 577 E. Sunny Dunes Road. Earl Gomez, young Harrison's roommate, discovered his friend's body after attempting to enter the bathroom and finding the door locked. Gomez awakened the apartment manager. Together they pushed the door open. It had been blocked by Harrison's body when he fell to the floor, Indio police surmised. Records at Palm Springs High School showed that Harrison had last attended school here in the 11th grade in 1968. A coroner's investigation into the cause of death is underway. Funeral arrangements for the youth are pending at Wiefels and Son Mortuary in Palm Springs.
