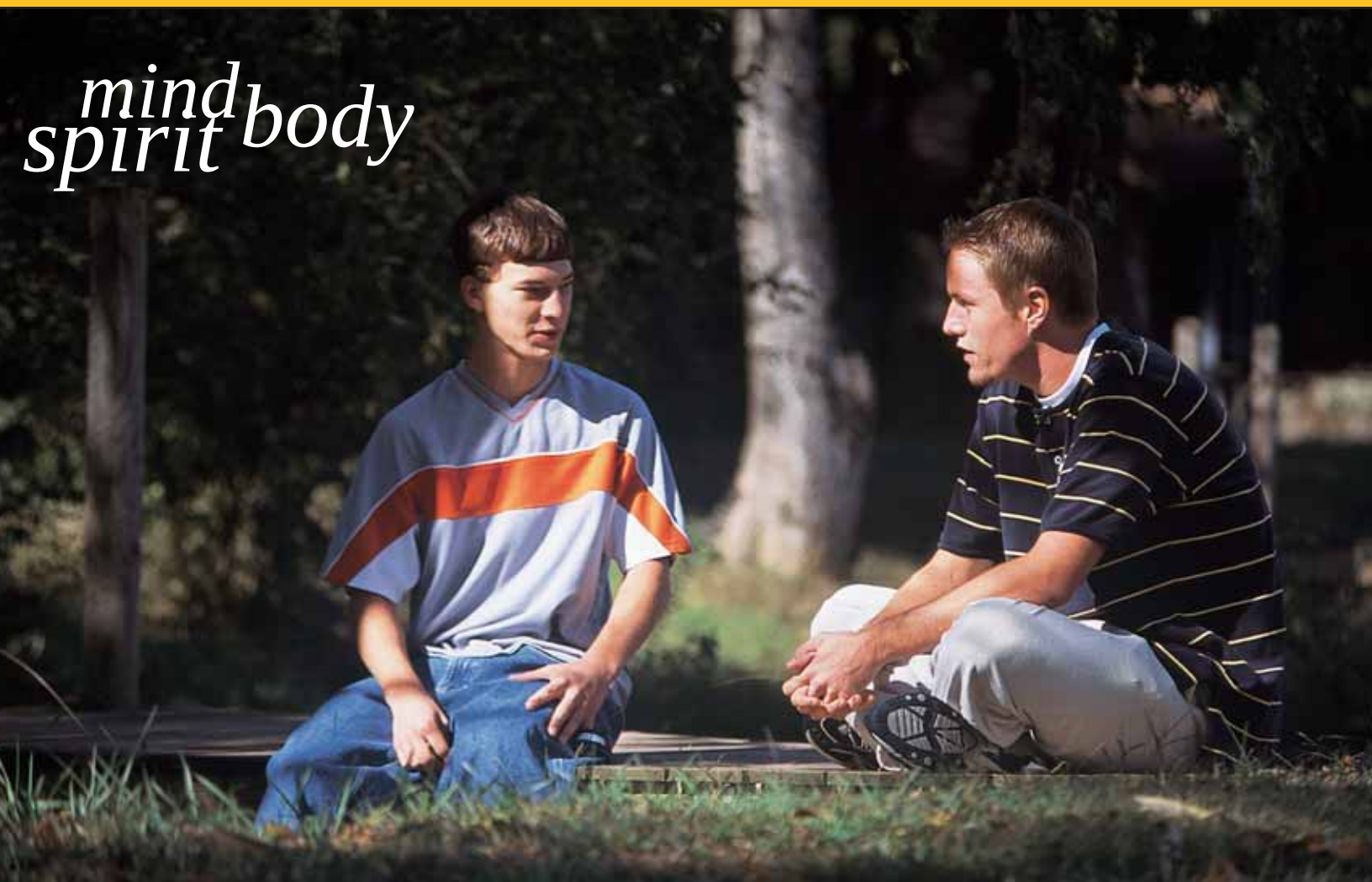

O U T D O O R T H E R A P

Three Springs' outdoor therapeutic programs utilize a Cognitive Behavioral Group model combined with a goal-directed group process that focuses on the "here and now" issues of the child's life. This therapeutic approach assists the



child in understanding and practicing the proper roles and boundaries that exist in everyone's life. Treatment Teams work with each family to develop an individualized, comprehensive Master Treatment Plan for their child and evaluate these plans monthly. All programs

have a private accredited school on campus and offer the opportunity to earn a high school diploma or G.E.D. Medication monitoring and nursing services are available at most of Three Springs' outdoor programs. Each Three Springs program is licensed by the state in which they are located.

Three Springs Paint Rock Valley is located on 600 woodland acres in Trenton, Alabama. The campuses provide residential treatment in two physically and programmatically distinct programs, one for boys ages 10-17 years old and one for girls 12-17 years old. These programs offer a unique combination of traditional psychiatric/psychological treatment services along with six, 7-week modules that include: Self-Management, Creative Development, Vocational, Therapeutic Drumming, Equine Therapy and Adventure Programming. The programs provide medication management, and offer specialized groups for sex abuse victims and alcohol/drug prevention education. Group counseling, individual and family counseling, and monthly parent support trainings are on going. Academics are continued at our on-site, accredited school. Adventure programming includes high and low ROPES and a climbing tower.

This program offers a unique combination of traditional psychiatric/psychological residential treatment services along with experiential, adventure based outdoor activities for boys 13-17 years old. Students receive academic instruction through an on-site private school. Other



highlights of the program include group counseling, family and individual counseling, medication management, specialized group for grief counseling, sexual abuse victims, spirituality, and alcohol/substance abuse education. Recreational and experiential activities take place on campus utilizing the on-site high and low ROPES course and climbing tower. Specific groups are also available that

are Christian based and provide encouragement of Christian values.

Aulder Academy is a college-preparatory boarding school with a personal growth curriculum. The school offers a traditional boarding environment with challenging, but supportive academics. The personal growth program helps to prepare young women for college-matriculation and independence. Aulder serves academically capable young women, grades 9-12, who will benefit from more structure and support than a typical boarding school provides. Aulder Academy's mission—to prepare students for the emotional, social, and academic challenges of college and independence—is well supported by the three integrated education departments: Counseling Services, Student Life, and Academics. Aulder's Counseling Services Department offers students a

warm, safe context for exploring and overcoming longstanding emotional concerns. The Student Life Department creates opportunities for students to improve social skills and learn life-management strategies. The Academic Department offers students small classes and a challenging curriculum, designed to build academic skills, disciplines, and confidence in preparation for college-level coursework. Each department tailors its approach to the needs of the individual students.

Vocational Program. The Therapeutic-Vocational Program is designed to meet the needs of boys who are lower functioning. Individual and group counseling, family counseling, social and life skills training, a vocational program, adventure based programming, and an on-site accredited school are just some of the services offered. Each resident is evaluated at the time of admission and a Master Treatment Plan as well as an educational plan is developed to meet their specific needs.

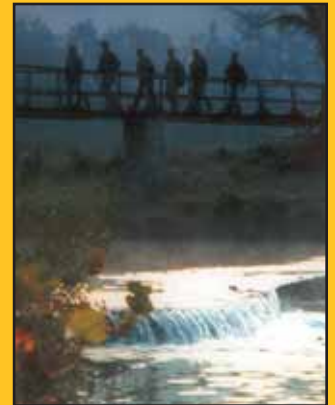

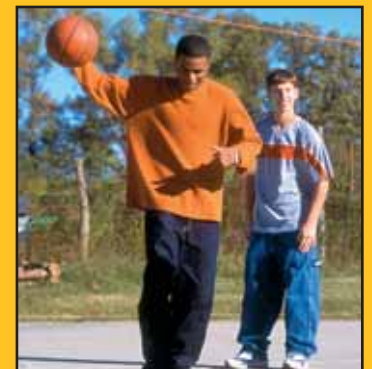

SECURE RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS

Three Springs' secure residential programs utilize a Cognitive Behavioral Group model aimed at helping residents recognize and change their thought process in an attempt to change inappropriate behaviors. These highly structured programs use a positive peer approach to assist each child in understanding and practicing the proper roles and boundaries that exist in everyone's life. These youth typically are in need of a more secure environment. Treatment Teams work with each family to develop an individualized, comprehensive Master Treatment Plan for their child and evaluate these plans monthly. All programs have an accredited school on campus and offer the opportunity to earn a high school diploma or G.E.D. Medication monitoring, psychiatric evaluations, and nursing services are available. Each Three Springs program is licensed by the state in which they reside.

Three Springs Courtland is a secure residential treatment program that provides special needs programming for males, ages 12-17, on two separate tracks. One track serves boys with sexual disorders and the other track serves boys with serious behavioral disorders. Each child has a Master Treatment Plan developed to address his needs and problem issues. The Treatment Team works closely with the family or guardian to address these needs, on an ongoing basis, to ensure success in accomplishing treatment goals. The positive peer culture approach reinforces socially appropriate behaviors in these young men. Therapeutic services include individual and group counseling, family counseling, specialized sexual issues treatment, social and life skills counseling, special needs groups, recreational therapy, adventure based programming, and aftercare services. Residents attend school on campus in an accredited academic program.

Located in Owens Cross Roads, Alabama, Three Springs New Beginnings is a secure, residential facility for girls ages 12-17. This program provides a highly structured environment with emphasis on social skills enhancement and the goal of successful reintegration back into the community. The positive peer culture approach reinforces socially appropriate behaviors in these young women who may have failed in other placements. Therapeutic services include group and



individual counseling, family counseling, social and life skills counseling, specialty groups, vocational skill training, adventure based activities, plus regular and special education services in an accredited school.

Three Springs' Creed

"We Believe . . . that every person, regardless of age, social standing, sex, education or race, is a person worthy of respect, and whose dignity as a human being should be considered at all times . . . that every child placed in our care has a goodness and strength to be found, regardless of their problems or unacceptable behavior... that the physical and emotional health of our residents is paramount. In no case should they be subjected to undue risk or emotional damage because of our actions . . . in discipline, based upon love and care, and that decisions affecting those in our care should never be made in anger or haste . . . that growth and maturation come by doing, and our residents should never be demeaned by having done for them what they can do for themselves . . . that each person involved in our treatment program, be they parent, child, social worker, probation officer, counselor or friend is a part of a cooperative team, and that little can be accomplished without the valuable contribution of each team member . . . in truth, whatever the potential for embarrassment . . . in fairness, knowing that decisions are never fair to all people all of the time . . . in building bridges, rather than burning them, and developing friendships based upon understanding and care for others . . . in goals and commitment, for without them our lives are undisciplined and non-directed."
