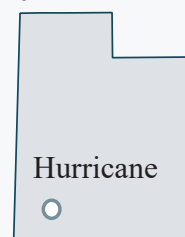

We have a proprietary Wild-Mustang program wherein our residents work with and train these beautiful animals while they work on themselves. With an understanding of Complex Trauma and an emphasis on family unity and connection, our program is designed to bring a sense of safety and well-being to your child.

We understand the dynamic of adopted families and strive to create a treatment milieu to address core needs in a non-judgmental and compassionate treatment milieu. We believe that adoptive families are the best families in our nation, and our goal is to bring to light the significant challenges that many of our families face in order to better provide those resources and healing they richly deserve.
